#### Levy A

Levy A was a Renewal, with no tax increase in November 2021, receiving voter support and approval at 74%.

#### Levy B

Levy B will be a Renewal, with no tax increase, Issue 1 on the November 4, 2025 ballot.








Citizens all over Montgomery County need Human Services, and the Human Services Renewal Levy is a necessity.

#### Human Services Help <u>Every</u> Montgomery County Community!




**Suburban Services = 49% / Central Services = 51%** 



## Spending

Spending on Human Services is reviewed regularly by the Human Services Levy Council (HSLC), which includes local, independent business leaders, financial experts, and citizen volunteers. The HSLC helps ensure we control costs, decide on priorities, and do our best to meet critical needs.

Human Services Levy Funding of \$137.9 million helps secure total budgets of \$211.5 million for a variety of community-based human services needs (as outlined to the right).
